

User Generated Content (UGC) Defined



- All content
 - Text, HTML, images, script, flash, etc.
- Contributed by users
 - Sellers, third-party developers, buyers, etc.
- To any eBay page
 - Listing description, About Me page, discussion forums, etc.

- "When creating a product detail page, sellers may not include HTML, DHTML, Java, scripts or other types of executables." (Amazon, 2008)
- "We do not allow any user-created HTML formatting anywhere on the site. We have designed Etsy to provide a consistent visual experience." (Etsy, 2008)



Current eBay Policy








Good UGC



- Most plain text
- Most HTML
- Most CSS
- Most images
- Cross-merch
- Slideshows
- Hit counters





Bad UGC



- Replace bid button
- Replace buy button
- Modify feedback score
- Steal user cookies
- Auto redirects

What We Plan to Do

Objectives



- Eliminate malicious UGC from site
- Enable meaningful behavior and style
- Cause minimal disruption to marketplace



eBay Safe Markup Language (ESML)



- Safe HTML-like language
- Safe subset of CSS
- No JavaScript, Flash, or other active content allowed in the core language
- Rich user experience supported via widgets
- Allows better control of UGC



Widgets



- Can use HTML, CSS, JS, Flash, etc.
- Will be provided by eBay and vetted third parties
- Must be hosted by eBay
- Cannot include obfuscation
- Will be surfaced via a "widget library"
- Will be rendered in their own iFrames



Sample ESML Code



```
<div id="intro">
    <span class="title">Hello I'm a title</span>

        I am a paragraph of text with an image.
        <img src="http://www.site.com/hello.jpg" alt="Hello" />

        </div>
```

- Tags are properly closed
- Attributes properly quoted
- Most standard HTML tags supported



Sample Widget Code

- New <widget> tag supported in ESML
- Reference preapproved rich content
- Are configurable by end users



What This Means to You

Safer Ecosystem



- Eliminates malicious UGC from site
- Improves buyer experience and increases trust
- Protects users and the eBay brand
- Provide developers with a safe platform on which to develop



New Opportunities



- To aid sellers in the transition process
- Provide ESML-compliant templates
- Work with eBay to build up a widget library
- Increased exposure to sellers



Code Changes



- Listings
 - Existing listings need to be updated—eventually
 - Listing templates must comply with ESML
- Rich content
 - Will only be provided by few select developers
 - Must be turned into widgets and vetted by eBay
- Listing tools
 - Should support new validation APIs
 - Should leverage new widget discovery APIs



Summary



- UGC is an industry-wide problem more so for eBay
- Current policy and initiatives are lacking
- eBay Safe Markup Language to take control of UGC
- Widgets to provide rich content/behavior
- Enforcing compliance starting Q1 2009
